Text: Matthew 18:21-35

Theme: Forgiving others in the body of Christ is not optional. If you will not forgive your brother no matter what he has done to you personally, Jesus says you are destined for eternal punishment. Those who understand how much they have been forgiven by God understand that nothing done to them compares to their offenses against God.

1. What question did Peter ask Jesus (v. 21a)?
2. What was Peter's suggested answer about how many times he should forgive (v. 21b)?
3. How many times did Jesus say one must forgive a brother who sins against him (v. 22)? What was the deeper meaning of Jesus' answer?
4. What did Jesus do to explain what He meant (vv. 23-35)?
5. How much did the first servant owe the king (v. 24)? How much money was this?
6. What did the king do for the servant who owed him an enormous amount of money (v. 27)?
7. What did the servant do after he left the king (v. 28)?
8. How much money did the second servant owe to the first servant (v. 28b)? How much was this amount worth?
9. What did the second servant ask of the first servant (v. 29)? How did the first servant answer (v. 30)?
10. What happened after this (v. 31)?
11. When the king heard what happened, what did he do (vv. 32-34)?
12. What was a key lesson of the story (v. 35)?
13. What does it mean to forgive someone? Does forgiving another mean ignoring or forgetting issues of truth or justice?
14. How can/do you forgive someone who has deeply hurt or wounded you?
15. Is forgiveness conditional or unconditional?
16. Does a failure to forgive mean that a Christian can lose his salvation? Is unforgiveness the unforgivable sin?
17. Can a true believer in Christ have a difficult time forgiving another?
18. What does it mean to forgive from the heart?
19. When should you forgive a fellow Christian who sins against you? When should you extend or pronounce your forgiveness to the one who sinned against you?
20. The passage deals with sinning against other Christians. May a Christian remain unforgiving if the person who sinned against him is not a Christian?

Announcement:

All are invited to the Lord's Table who have been baptized, have publicly professed faith in (either before a congregation of the Lord's Church or to a body of Elders in a church where the Gospel of Christ is embraced) and allegiance to the Lord Jesus Christ as the Savior from your sins, and are members of the visible Church of the Lord Jesus Christ.

If you have not publicly professed faith in Christ Jesus – the eternal Son of God who took on human flesh, lived a perfect, sinless life, died on the cross for sins, rose bodily from the dead, and who is returning to this earth in power and glory – please refrain from partaking of the Lord's Table.

We invite you to respond to the Gospel by first understanding that you have sinned personally against the God who made you and have violated His good and right laws for you to follow. God is holy and has every right to separate you from Himself and from all that is good and beautiful because of your freely chosen disobedience to Him. But the really good news is that you can be restored to the God who made you because of what Christ Jesus has done on the cross as a perfect substitute and payment for the penalty that you owe and deserve. Simply believing and trusting in what Jesus did for you means you will belong to the LORD God forever.

Abraham, the Biblical example of one who was restored to God by faith alone, trusted God's promise and the LORD God credited it, that trust, to him as righteousness. God has shown His love to the world, and to you, by giving His only Son that whoever believes in Him should not die and be separated from Him forever but rather have the life man was created to have in the presence of God, a life that never ends.

This means that you cannot DO anything to earn your place with God. However, a true faith in Christ Jesus comes from a God-given desire that will produce behavior that does those things that are pleasing to Him.

Please seek out and contact one of our Pastors or Elders to talk more about your eternal future. You can find their contact information in this bulletin. They will be glad to show you from Scripture, God's Word, how you can have a relationship with God through Christ Jesus and have true peace and security with Him.

If you have professed faith in Christ Jesus, have been baptized, and are a member of the Church, yet there is a distance between you and the LORD because of cherished and unrepentant sin and transgressions of God's laws, we warn you to refrain from partaking the elements of the Lord's Table today. Scripture tells us that partaking of the Lord's Table is a participation, a communion, in the body and blood of Christ (1 Cor. 10:16). God's people cannot partake of His holy Table while at the same time engaging in deliberate and conscious violations of His commands for us as His holy people. If this is true with you, the LORD graciously promises that, if you confess and turn from whatever thinking or behavior that is contrary to His nature and His Word, He is faithful to forgive and to cleanse you from all unrighteousness (1 John 1:9). Until you have confessed and turned from whatever this breach of faith might be, please refrain from partaking of the Lord's Table.

This does not mean that as a professing follower of Christ you are required to be perfect and flawless before communing with Christ at His Table. The Table is for you to be nourished and strengthened even more in your faith and love for Christ. You may have worries and doubts that God loves or hears you because your faith is weak. You may have sinned, confessed, and turned from it to the Lord before partaking, but still your heart condemns you. When you come to the Lord's Table, the Lord by faith assures you that you belong to Him, and He belongs to you. If, despite your sins and imperfections, you can truly say that the LORD is your Shepherd, that the name of Christ and His smile is the desire of your soul, then take the LORD at His word that you are ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven!

Come, and dine with your Lord and Savior.

CONFESSION OF SIN

Gracious Father, in Your mercy You forgave us a debt of sin that we could never begin to repay.

We confess we have not shown like mercy to our family in Christ.

We have harbored anger and bitterness toward our brethren.

We have closed our hearts to their needs.

We have turned our faces away from their presence.

We have inwardly demanded repayment for wrongs done to us.

We confess our sin of not forgiving our brethren from our hearts.

We acknowledge we have placed limits on our forgiveness.

We admit we have forgotten how much You have forgiven us.

Cleanse our hardness of heart.

Forgive our unforgiveness.

Pardon our lack of mercy.

Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.

We ask in the Name of our Lord and Savior, Christ Jesus.
