NEW SUNDAY WORSHIP SCHEDULE STARTING JUNE 6, 2021

The Session is making plans to return to our original worship schedule starting on the first Sunday in June (June 6). Worship will begin at 10:45 a.m.

For those who wish or need to maintain distance and caution, there will be a dedicated section behind the piano where worshippers can remain distanced from one another and where face coverings will be worn. Entering and exiting will be through the back entrance of the sanctuary.

The Session would like to do more canvassing and planning before holding the Fellowship Dinners after the first Sunday worship service. Therefore, we will NOT be having a Fellowship Dinner after worship on June 6. We anticipate enjoying these times of fellowship soon, hopefully before the end of summer. More information on this will be forthcoming.

As for the Sunday School schedule, our intention is also to begin offering the normal schedule on June 6, but this will ultimately depend upon staffing of the various grade levels and determining certain procedures to be observed.

We appeal to the members of the congregation to consider helping out as teachers, assistants, or backups in one of the following areas for the coming year, especially if you have not done so before: Nursery, Pre-K to 2nd grade, Upper Elementary Grades 3-5, Middle Grades 6-8, and High School.

Our hope is to begin offering Sunday School as soon as these necessary matters are settled and in place. If enough help out in these important ministries the load can be shared more broadly.

A committee of Elders has been tasked by the Session to coordinate the necessary staffing needs and the logistics of conducting the classes and to bring recommendations to the Session at the next stated meeting of the Session on May 10. We welcome input and feedback, so if you wish to offer an opinion or a concern, please let the members of this committee know as soon as possible. The members of this committee are: Pastor Matt, RE Joe Deane, and RE Dan Bredbenner.

Further announcements about more of the specifics involved in the Sunday School ministry will be forthcoming.

We ask the body to be patient and understanding with one another during this transition. We are trying to anticipate as many scenarios, perspectives, and angles as we can, but likely there may be something overlooked.

Please keep this next phase of congregational life in your prayers as we work toward regaining and restoring the fuller mission of the Church to gather and perfect the saints of God.

QUESTIONS TO DISCUSS AND CONSIDER AT HOME OR IN SMALL GROUPS

- To what city had Jesus almost arrived (v. 1a)?
- 2. In what little town did Jesus make a brief stop? Where was this town situated (v. 1b)? What does the name of this town mean?
- 3. What did Jesus want to two of His disciples to do for Him (vv. 2-3)?
- 4. What was the prearranged password in case someone objected to the request being made by Jesus (v. 3)?
- 5. What was the significance of Jesus' plan (vv. 4-5)?
- 6. How many animals were brought to Jesus (v. 7)? Why?
- 7. What did the crowd do when Jesus began riding the animal (v. 8)?
- 8. What was the cry of the crowds as Jesus began riding to the city (v. 9)?
- 9. What was the reaction of the people in Jerusalem to the manner in which Jesus was entering their city (v. 10)?
- 10. What was the answer of the crowds who traveled with Jesus to those who wondered Who He was (v. 11)?
- 11. What does the term "Messiah" mean?
- 12. Why do you suppose for the months and years prior to this that Jesus downplayed that He was the Messiah? How had Jesus kept His identity concealed? Had anyone heard and recognized that Jesus was the Messiah prior to His entrance into Jerusalem?
- 13. How does Christ make an entrance into your life?
- 14. Why is it important to say that no one "makes" Jesus to be Lord? What controversy involved a view that said Jesus can be a person's Savior, but not necessarily his "Lord?"
- 15. How can it be claimed that peace has come to the world when there is still so much strife and conflict?

THE LORD'S SUPPER

Announcement:

All are invited to the Lord's Table who have been baptized, have publicly professed faith in (either before a congregation of the Lord's Church or to a body of Elders in a church where the Gospel of Christ is embraced) and allegiance to the Lord Jesus Christ as the Savior from your sins, and are members of the visible Church of the Lord Jesus Christ.

If you have not publicly professed faith in Christ Jesus – the eternal Son of God who took on human flesh, lived a perfect, sinless life, died on the cross for sins, rose bodily from the dead, and who is returning to this earth in power and glory – please refrain from partaking of the Lord's Table.

We invite you to respond to the Gospel by first understanding that you have sinned personally against the God who made you and have violated His good and right laws for you to follow. God is holy and has every right to separate you from Himself and from all that is good and beautiful because of your freely chosen disobedience to Him. But the really good news is that you can be restored to the God who made you because of what Christ Jesus has done on the cross as a perfect substitute and payment for the penalty that you owe and deserve. Simply believing and trusting in what Jesus did for you means you will belong to the LORD God forever. Abraham, the Biblical example of one who was restored to God by faith alone, trusted God's promise and the LORD God credited it, that trust, to him as righteousness. God has shown His love to the world, and to you, by giving His only Son that whoever believes in Him should not die and be separated from Him forever but rather have the life man was created to have in the presence of God, a life that never ends.

This means that you cannot DO anything to earn your place with God. However, a true faith in Christ Jesus comes from a Godgiven desire that will produce behavior that does those things that are pleasing to Him.

Please seek out and contact one of our Pastors or Elders to talk

more about your eternal future. You can find their contact information in this bulletin. They will be glad to show you from Scripture, God's Word, how you can have a relationship with God through Christ Jesus and have true peace and security with Him.

If you have professed faith in Christ Jesus, have been baptized, and are a member of the Church, yet there is a distance between you and the LORD because of cherished and unrepentant sin and transgressions of God's laws, we warn you to refrain from partaking the elements of the Lord's Table today. Scripture tells us that partaking of the Lord's Table is a participation, a communion, in the body and blood of Christ (1 Cor. 10:16). God's people cannot partake of His holy Table while at the same time engaging in deliberate and conscious violations of His commands for us as His holy people. If this is true with you, the LORD graciously promises that, if you confess and turn from whatever thinking or behavior that is contrary to His nature and His Word, He is faithful to forgive and to cleanse you from all unrighteousness (1 John 1:9). Until you have confessed and turned from whatever this breach of faith might be, please refrain from partaking of the Lord's Table.

This does not mean that as a professing follower of Christ you are required to be perfect and flawless before communing with Christ at His Table. The Table is for you to be nourished and strengthened even more in your faith and love for Christ. You may have worries and doubts that God loves or hears you because your faith is weak. You may have sinned, confessed, and turned from it to the Lord before partaking, but still your heart condemns you. When you come to the Lord's Table, the Lord by faith assures you that you belong to Him, and He belongs to you. If, despite your sins and imperfections, you can truly say that the LORD is your Shepherd, that the name of Christ and His smile is the desire of your soul, then take the LORD at His word that you are ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven!

Come, and dine with your Lord and Savior.
