Title: "An Exhortation to Maintain Unity"

Text: Ephesians 4:1-6

Theme: Because God in His all-encompassing plan has made us alive in Christ when we were spiritually dead and has united into one body all who trust in Christ, Christians are to live worthy of their call by striving to maintain the unity that God's Spirit establishes.

1. What three main things does Paul urge Christians to do (vv. 1-3)?
2. How are Christians to respond to God's call upon their lives (v. 1)?
3. What does it mean to "bear with one another" (v. 3)?
4. What four ways does Paul cite as to how Christians must bear with one another (v. 2)?
5. Define or describe each of these four ways. What do they mean? What would they look like in practice? How would you recognize them?
6. How is the unity of the Spirit to be preserved and maintained (v. 3)?
7. State the seven reasons Paul gives for why Christians are to maintain unity in the Church (vv. 4-6).
8. What is the "calling" to which Christians have been called?
9. Does a Christian "walking in a manner worthy" of his or her calling gain standing and merit before the LORD? Explain.
10. How might you determine if you, or another Christian, is not walking worthy of God's call upon your life?
11. How should Elders in the Church respond and deal with Christians that are not walking worthy of God's call? How should the Church respond to Elders who are not walking worthily to God's call?
12. In your experience as a member of the Lord's Church, are humility, gentleness, patience, and love something you have normally experienced from other brethren?
13. What do humility, gentleness, patience, and love look like in your interactions with your Christian brethren?
14. How might you better bear with others in the body of Christ? How might others in the body of Christ better bear with you?
15. Can you recite the PCA's Fifth Membership Vow? How well are you carrying this out?
16. What should eagerness to maintain unity in the body of Christ look like?
17. Is it wrong to separate and disunite physically from a church body to which you belong? What might be reasons to separate? Can such a separation contribute to overall unity in the body of Christ? How might such a separation be godly? Sinful?
18. What are some positive steps you can take to promote the unity of the church body – and its purity?
19. How can there be only one baptism when so many different groups within the Church practice baptism so differently?
20. Which would you strive to preserve and maintain first: truth or unity? How would you balance the two? Which would you sacrifice for the sake of the other? Is it possible to be united when the truth is compromised? Is it possible to promote the truth when unity is lacking?

## THE LORD'S SUPPER

### **Announcement:**

All are invited to the Lord's Table who have been baptized, have publicly professed (either before a congregation of the Lord's Church or to a body of Elders in a church where the Gospel of Christ is embraced) faith in and allegiance to the Lord Jesus Christ as the Savior from your sins, and are members of the visible Church of the Lord Jesus Christ.

If you have not publicly professed faith in Christ Jesus – the eternal Son of God who took on human flesh, lived a perfect, sinless life, died on the cross for sins, rose bodily from the dead, and who is returning to this earth in power and glory – please refrain from partaking of the Lord's Table.

We invite you to respond to the Gospel by first understanding that you have sinned personally against the God who made you and have violated His good and right laws for you to follow. God is holy and has every right to separate you from Himself and from all that is good and beautiful because of your freely chosen disobedience to Him. But the really good news is that you can be restored to the God who made you because of what Christ Jesus has done on the cross as a perfect substitute and payment for the penalty that you owe and deserve. Simply believing and trusting in what Jesus did for you means you will belong to the LORD God forever.

Abraham, the Biblical example of one who was restored to God by faith alone, trusted God's promise and the LORD God credited it, that trust, to him as righteousness. God has shown His love to the world, and to you, by giving His only Son that whoever believes in Him should not die and be separated from Him forever but rather have the life man was created to have in the presence of God, a life that never ends.

This means that you cannot DO anything to earn your place with God. However, a true faith in Christ Jesus comes from a God-given desire that will produce behavior that does those things that are pleasing to Him.

Please seek out and contact one of our Pastors or Elders to talk more about your eternal future. You can find their contact information in this bulletin. They will be glad to show you from Scripture, God's Word, how you can have a relationship with God through Christ Jesus and have true peace and security with Him.

If you have professed faith in Christ Jesus, have been baptized, and are a member of the Church, yet there is a distance between you and the LORD because of cherished and unrepentant sin and transgressions of God's laws, we warn you to refrain from partaking the elements of the Lord's Table today. Scripture tells us that partaking of the Lord's Table is a participation, a communion, in the body and blood of Christ (1 Cor. 10:16). God's people cannot partake of His holy Table while at the same time engaging in deliberate and conscious violations of His commands for us as His holy people. If this is true with you, the LORD graciously promises that, if you confess and turn from whatever thinking or behavior that is contrary to His nature and His Word, He is faithful to forgive and to cleanse you from all unrighteousness (1 John 1:9). Until you have confessed and turned from whatever this breach of faith might be, please refrain from partaking of the Lord's Table.

This does not mean that as a professing follower of Christ you are required to be perfect and flawless before communing with Christ at His Table. The Table is for you to be nourished and strengthened even more in your faith and love for Christ. You may have worries and doubts that God loves or hears you because your faith is weak. You may have sinned, confessed, and turned from it to the Lord before partaking, but still your heart condemns you. When you come to the Lord's Table, the Lord by faith assures you that you belong to Him, and He belongs to you. If, despite your sins and imperfections, you can truly say that the LORD is your Shepherd, that the name of Christ and His smile is the desire of your soul, then take the LORD at His word that you are ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven!

Come, and dine with your Lord and Savior.
