- 1. What sad action takes place in verses 2-13?
- 2. What words and phrases point to the fact that this action is being initiated (v. 2)?
- 3. What dire consequences would happen if the unfaithful spouse (Gomer and Israel) did not cease her infidelities (vv. 3-4)?
- 4. From what source did the unfaithful spouse *think* she was having her needs met and receiving good things (v. 5)?
- 5. What actions would the LORD God take if Israel continued to pursue her spiritual "lovers" (vv. 6-13)?
- 6. What does God promise Israel in verses 14-23?
- 7. What would be the first step the LORD would take to reclaim Israel (vv. 14-15)?
- 8. What tragedy in Israel's history occurred at a place named "the Valley of Achor" (v. 15)?
- 9. After this action (vv. 14-15), what would the LORD then do regarding Israel (vv. 16-20)?
- 10. What would the LORD God make with Israel (v. 18)? To what does this point?
- 11. How will the LORD then bless His restored bride (vv. 21-22)?
- 12. What will happen to the names that Hosea's children were given and what they mean (vv. 22-23)?

- 15. When should a spouse involve the Elders of the church when experiencing marital difficulties?
- 16. Is it a mark of unforgiveness if a spouse who is sinned against exercises the option to divorce when Scriptural grounds exist?
- 17. Is divorce the unpardonable sin? Why or why not?
- 18. How do the New Testament writers (Romans 9:25-26; 1 Peter 2:10) understand and apply the promise of reclamation in Hosea 2:23?
- 19. In what ways do we often view God as a "taskmaster" instead of a "husband"?
- 20. How can you prevent viewing God as your "Baal" and instead respond to Him as your loving and caring "spouse"?
