8.	What was the fifth covenantal violation that involved other countries (vv. 9-10)?
9.	What two images particularly warned of the LORD's judgment to come upon Israel (vv. 1, 14)?
10.	What were the three ways that Israel trusted in her own strength rather than upon her covenant God (vv. 9-14)?
11.	What are the two covenants that order man's relationship to God?
12.	What are the two main aspects of every covenant?
13.	Who is the federal head of the Covenant of Works?
14.	Who is the federal head of the Covenant of Grace?
15.	What covenant governs everyone who does not believe and follow Christ?

16.	Can a person governed by the Covenant of Works become a member of the Covenant of Grace? If so, how?
17.	If someone does not know about or understand what a covenant is does this mean God's covenant does not apply to him or her? Why or why not?
