Questions to Answer from the Text:

- 1. Who or what sets us free (v. 1a)?
- 2. Because we are now spiritually free, what must we not do (v. 1b)?
- 3. What were the Galatian Christians in danger of doing (vv. 2-3)?
- 4. What would this do in terms of their relationship with Christ (vv. 4-6)?
- 5. What was not an offense to the natural man (vv. 7-12)?
- 6. How is spiritual freedom NOT to be used (v. 13b)?
- 7. How is spiritual freedom to be used (v. 13c)?

Questions to Ponder and Reflect upon the Teaching and Applications Based on the Text:

- 8. What is a narrow view of Christian Liberty distinct from a broader view of Christian Liberty? [Consult *Westminster Confession of Faith*, 20.1]
- 9. What is meant by "negative liberties"? What is meant by "positive liberties"?
- 10. What does "objective liberty" mean? What does "subjective liberty" mean?
- 11. Did believers under the Old Covenant have spiritual freedom?
- 12. If believers under the Old Covenant had spiritual freedom, why would submitting to the Old Covenant requirements bring the believer into bondage and sever from Christ?
- 13. What are some of the expanded freedoms and benefits of believers under the New Covenant? [Consult *Westminster Confession of Faith*, 20.1]
- 14. Can someone outside of Christ experience spiritual freedom? Why or why not?
- 15. In what ways do you utilize and enjoy greater access to God than the Old Covenant believer?
- 16. How has Christian liberty enabled you to serve Christ?
