Questions to Answer from the Text:

- 1. What was Moses' first objection to answering God's call (3:11)?
- 2. How did God respond to this first objection (3:12)?
- 3. What was Moses' second objection to God's call (3:13)?
- 4. What did God say to this objection by Moses (3:14)?
- 5. What is God's name that He revealed to Moses (3:14)?
- 6. From what word does this name of God derive?
- 7. How long was God to be known by the name He revealed to Moses (3:15)?
- 8. What was Moses to do when he arrived in Egypt (3:16-17)?
- 9. What were Moses and the Elders of Israel to request of Pharaoh (3:18)?
- 10. How would Pharaoh respond to this request (3:19)?
- 11. What would God do to make Pharaoh comply (3:20)?
- 12. When the Israelites were to leave Egypt, how would the Egyptian people act toward them (3:21-22)?

Questions for Reflection and Discussion:

- 13. Why do you think Moses thought he was insignificant to speak to Pharaoh and to bring the people out of that land?
- 14. In what ways could the presence of God with Moses motivate him to overcome his sense of inferiority and appear before Pharaoh?
- 15. Was Moses' participation in the Exodus determined beforehand by God? If so, how did Moses freely choose his response? What Scriptures apply to your answer?
- 16. Why do you think God delayed as long as He did to begin delivering His people from Egypt?
- 17. How do you feel when God does not seem to answer your prayers right away? What makes you either give up or persevere?
- 18. What does "sovereignty" mean?
- 19. How does God's name communicate His sovereignty?
- 20. What is the basis of God's sovereignty?
- 21. How does God's sovereignty either encourage or discourage you?
- 22. Do we increase God's majesty when we glorify and praise Him? Why or why not?
- 23. What are some implications and consequences if God is not sovereign?
- 24. Why does God's sovereignty matter?
