“Moses, the Excuse-Maker, Meets God, the Master Excuse-Destroyer” (Part 2) -- Exodus 4:1-17

Questions to Answer from the Text:

1. What was Moses' third objection to God's call (v. 1)?
2. In answering this objection, what common object did God use that would prove He had spoken to Moses (v. 2)?
3. What was the first sign God demonstrated to Moses that would confirm to Israel that God had appeared to him (vv. 3-4)?
4. What was the second sign God gave to Moses (vv. 6-7)?
5. What was the third sign God gave to Moses (vv. 8-9)?
6. What was Moses' fourth objection to God's call (v. 10)?
7. What was God's answer to this objection (vv. 11-12)?
8. What was Moses' fifth objection (v. 13)?
9. How did the LORD respond to this objection (v. 14a)?
10. How did the LORD help Moses overcome this objection (vv. 14b-15)?
11. What was Moses' brother tasked to do (v. 16a)?
12. What was Moses not to forget to take with him when he went to Egypt (v. 17)?

Questions to Ponder and Reflect upon the Teaching and Applications Based on the Text:

13. What is one of the main purposes for the miracles that are recorded in Scripture?
14. How frequently did miracles happen in recorded Scripture? What deductions can we conclude from this?
15. Do confirmatory miracles occur today? Why or why not?
16. Do miraculous occurrences happen today? Why or why not? If so, how? When?
17. What are some differences between miraculous occurrences that might happen today and the confirmatory miracles given by God as recorded in Scripture?
18. Does God get angry with anyone today? If so, why? If not, why not?
19. How is God's anger unlike ours?
20. Should preachers proclaim and emphasize the anger and wrath of God? Why or why not?
21. What common objects does God specifically use to accommodate our weaknesses when we are gathered for corporate worship?
22. Can we use anything we please to mediate God's presence with us? Why or why not?
23. If you had been in Moses' place, would you have hesitated when God called you to the task He called Moses to perform? Why or why not?
24. In the message, the statement was made that Jesus did not hesitate when the Father appointed Him to be the Redeemer of His people. How would you then explain Jesus' wrestling with going to the cross in Matthew 26:36-46?
