6.	How devastating were the swarms of locusts on the crops and trees of the Egyptians (v. 15b)?
7.	How did the LORD remove the locusts from the land (v. 19)?
8.	What was the ninth plague that came upon Egypt (v. 21a)?
9.	What would this plague be like (vv. 21b-23)?
10.	. How long did the darkness last (vv. 22-23)?
11.	. What concession was Pharaoh willing to make to rid his land of darkness (v. 24)?
12	How did Pharaoh end his meeting with Moses on this occasion (v. 28)?

13. What is compromise? 14. What are the pros and cons of compromise? 15. What principles guide you in whether or not you might compromise on an issue? 16. What concessions would you NOT be willing to make in order to worship the LORD God? 17. Do you see any mercy in the final set of three plagues? If so, where? 18. What were some instances where the Lord Jesus spoke using the "three-day" indicator? 21. To what does the "three-day" theme ultimately point? 22.
