Title: “The Final Set of Three Plagues Displays God’s Merciful Restraint” (Part 2)

Text: Exodus 10:1-29

Theme: Pharaoh and the Egyptians experienced darkness for three days, a darkness that paralyzed and confined them. Our Lord was under the realm of darkness for three days, only He was not paralyzed or ultimately restricted by it. He conquered it.
