August 24, 2025 – Questions to Discuss and Consider at Home or in Small Group "The Requirements for Observing Passover" -- Exodus 12:43-51

Questions for Younger Ones (ages 5-18) to Answer from the Text:

- 1. What did the LORD give to Moses and Aaron to pass on to the people of Israel (v. 43a)?
- 2. Whom did the LORD say could not eat the Passover (vv. 43b-45)?
- 3. What permitted a slave who was purchased by an Israelite to partake of the Passover (v. 44)?
- 4. Where was the Passover meal to be eaten (v. 46a)?
- 5. What could not be taken outside the house (v. 46b)?
- 6. What must the Israelites never do when preparing the Passover lamb for sacrifice (v. 46c)?
- 7. Who was required to observe the Passover feast (v. 47)?
- 8. What did a stranger who wanted to partake of the Passover need to do (v. 48a)?
- 9. How was the stranger to be treated if he fulfilled the requirement to partake of the Passover (v. 48c)?
- 10. Who absolutely was forbidden to eat the Passover meal (v. 48d)?
- 11. Were there to be different rules for the stranger and the Israelite when observing the Passover meal (v. 49)?
- 12. How did the Israelite people respond to the LORD's instruction given to Moses and Aaron (v. 50)?
- 13. On what day did the Israelites leave Egypt (v. 51a)?
- 14. How did the LORD bring out the Israelites from the land of Egypt (v. 51b)?

Questions for Reflection and Discussion:

- 15. Are there differences between the foreigner, the stranger, and the sojourner? If so, what might they be?
- 16. Why were a foreigner and a hired worker not allowed to eat the Passover, but a stranger was allowed?
- 17. Why was a slave allowed to eat the Passover?
- 18. Why was circumcision required before eating the Passover meal?
- 19. Why was a stranger required to circumcise all the males in his household before *he*, the stranger, could partake of the Passover?

- 20. When the stranger was circumcised to partake of the Passover, did that mean he was a full citizen of Israel? Why or why not?
- 21. Why is the Lord's Supper the fulfillment of Passover?
- 22. What similarities and differences are there between Passover and the Lord's Supper?
- 23. Should people be excluded from participating in the Lord's Supper even though they may desire to do so? If so, how should they be excluded? If not, why not?
- 24. What does the Reformed practice of "fencing the Table" mean?
- 25. What must precede the administration of the Lord's Supper? Why?
- 26. How can someone participate in the Lord's Supper?
- 27. When should a Christian decline to partake of the Lord's Supper? When should they NOT decline to partake of the Lord's Supper?
- 28. Are there ways the Lord's Supper can be abused by *declining* to partake of the Lord's Supper? If so, how?
- 29. Should a Christian leave the worship service after the sermon but before the serving the Lord's Supper because he is pressed for time?
- 30. What is meant by the "corporate" aspect of the Lord's Supper? What is meant by the "individual" aspect of the Lord's Supper? Which is more important? Why?
