- 4. How is a person justified before God (v. 16a)?
- 5. What must a Jew do to be justified before God (v. 16b)?
- 6. What can never be a way for someone to be right before God (v. 16c)?

- 7. How critical is the doctrine of justification?
- 8. Are people saved because they understand the doctrine of justification by faith?
- 9. Did Martin Luther discover the doctrine of justification by faith alone? Explain.
- 10. Can a Christian know that he is justified before God? Why or why not?
- 11. Can a person be justified before God and not know it? Explain.
- 12. Can a Christian develop to the point where he eventually is justified before God? Why or why not?
- 13. What are the positive and negative aspects of justification that the definition given in the Sermon Notes outline highlights? [See *Westminster Shorter Catechism*, Q. 33]
- 14. What does "imputation" mean?
- 15. Is justification a "legal fiction"? Why or why not?
- 16. What is the ground of justification?
- 17. What are some insufficient grounds that others have given for why a person is justified?
- 18. How can we claim that justification is by faith "alone" when Scripture does not use the word "alone" as a modifier?
- 19. How do works play a role in justification?
- 20. How were people justified before God before Christ died?
- 21. Do the Sacraments bring about justification? Why or why not?
- 22. What is the significance of the word "justified" being used in the present tense in James 2:24?
- 23. Will a person perish eternally if he or she is not justified before God? Why or why not?
