October 19, 2025 – Questions to Discuss and Consider at Home or in Small Group "Repentance That Leads to Life" – Isaiah 30:15-26

Questions for Younger Ones (ages 5-18) to Answer from the Text:

- 1. What are the two requirements God says are necessary for Judah's salvation (v. 15a)?
- 2. How did the people of Judah respond to God's promise of salvation (vv. 15b-16)?
- 3. What would happen to Judah because of their refusal to listen to the LORD their God (vv. 16b-17)?
- 4. For what was the LORD "waiting" to show to Judah (v. 18a)?
- 5. What description does the LORD God give of Himself (v. 18c)?
- 6. How would Judah be blessed by the LORD (v. 18d)?
- 7. Who would not hide from the people of Judah but would be seen by them (v. 20)?
- 8. How would Judah respond when this person came to them (v. 22)?
- 9. What would be some of the conditions that would result once this person was revealed (vv. 23-26)?
- 10. What will be the condition of the people of Judah when the LORD acts on their behalf (v. 26b)?

Questions for Reflection and Discussion:

- 11. How does Isaiah 30:15-26 illustrate the relationship between repentance, restoration, and God's blessings?
- 12. What might be a typical, non-Biblical view of repentance?
- 13. If God's grace alone is sufficient for salvation, how can repentance be necessary for salvation?
- 14. How is repentance an "evangelical grace"?
- 15. Should a Christian undergo a ritual of penance to effect and establish his or her repentance?
- 16. What Biblical persons come to mind who truly repented?
- 17. What Biblical persons come to mind that either feigned repentance or refused to repent?
- 18. What are some guiding principles about how one should go about the process of actually repenting?
- 19. Can repentance be a national or ethnic requirement and not just an individual obligation? Explain.
- 20. Does God forgive a repentant murderer? racist? rapist? child molester?
