“God Has Good Works Planned for You” – Titus 2:7-3:11

Questions for Younger Ones (ages 5-18) to Answer from the Text:

1. In every way (“all respects”), what was Titus to demonstrate (2:7a)?
2. What was the purpose for which Titus was to model good works (2:8b)?
3. What does God’s grace in bringing us salvation train us to do (2:11-12)?
4. What is the wonderful hope that Christians who believe the Good News and do what is good are eagerly expecting (2:13)?
5. What good thing are we to do toward rulers and authorities (3:1a)?
6. For what are Christians to be ready and prepared (3:1b)?
7. What good attitudes and behaviors must Christians exhibit towards everyone (3:2)?
8. Why has God NOT saved us, and why HAS God saved us (3:4-5)?
9. What are God’s people to be mindful to do (3:8a)?
10. What are good things for Christians to avoid? Why? (3:9)

Questions for Reflection and Discussion:

11. Do you agree or disagree that Protestants are hesitant, and perhaps even remiss, to discuss good works? Explain.
12. How do you know you are doing a good work?
13. If even our best works are contaminated with sin and self, why even do them?
14. What is the role of good works in our salvation?
15. What role do works play in our justification?
16. Can non-Christians do good works?
17. Why are even our best works incapable of meriting justification before God?
18. If even our best works are contaminated with sin and self, how can God accept them?
19. What does it mean to be purposeful about doing good works?
20. How can you discern if any good work you do is driven by the right motives?
